## Pastor's Perusings—Rays of Divine Mercy

Happy Easter! He is Risen! Alleluia! Easter is a time to marvel at and enter into the victory of Christ. Jesus stooped down that he might raise us up to share in new and abundant life — life beyond our imagination — the very life of God. This new life is made possible by the extraordinary gift of Divine Mercy. We see God's mercy flowing on the first two Sundays of Easter. On Easter Sunday night, Jesus encounters the majority of the Apostles for the first time since Holy Thursday. His last encounter with them in the Garden of Gethsemane concluded with them abandoning our precious Lord at the arrival of the Temple guards. At Jesus' darkest hour, the Apostles fled in fear, leaving him all alone.

On Easter Sunday night, our risen Lord, aware of their great sorrow, sets their weakness and sin aside as he reconnects with them in the Upper Room. Twice he offers his peace, the rich fruit of his forgiveness. A week later, the Good Shepherd goes in search of Thomas, who was absent on that first night, to bring him back into the fold. He does so by inviting Thomas to place his hand into the wounds in his side, a most profound symbol of Divine Mercy, from which flowed blood and water.

It is clear that the proclamation of Divine Mercy is equally critical to the Easter season as it is to the Lenten season. In fact, on the night of the resurrection, Jesus institutes the sacrament of penance and reconciliation: "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." The unique participation of the Apostles in the priestly mission of Christ includes the God-given ability to offer God's forgiveness to individuals who approach the Lord with genuine sorrow and a measure of a desire to turn away from their sins.

From the first day of the resurrection, Jesus gives clear direction to the church. At the very heart of the church's mission is the ministry of reconciliation. After extending his merciful peace to the Apostles, his first words are: "As the Father sent me, so I send you." Then, he breaths the Holy Spirit on them and grants this capacity to extend his forgiveness to the sorrowful. Mercy is God's greatest gift; it opens the door to the fullness of life — union with God, healing, peace, joy and meaningful purpose. Pope John Paul II went so far as to declare this Sunday "Divine Mercy Sunday." He was quite inspired by the holiness of St. Faustina Kowalska and the unique mission given to her by our Lord himself, who mystically appeared to this Sister of our Lady of Mercy in 14 revelations. Therein, he asked her to proclaim to all the world the beauty and depth of God's mercy and spread devotion to a celebration of Divine Mercy.

The Diary of St. Faustina contains these beautiful revelations. They highlight, in wonderfully warm language, God's burning desire to reconcile the whole world to him and to heal every human being from the wounds of sin. She reminds the world that God's love is so much more powerful than the worst of our sins.

On one occasion, the Lord spoke these words to St. Faustina: "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sin be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity."

This Divine Mercy Sunday, our *Confirmandi* will be having their retreat in preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on May 11th. Please pray for our *confirmandi* that they may open themselves to the transformative power of God's Divine Mercy. - Fr. Golna

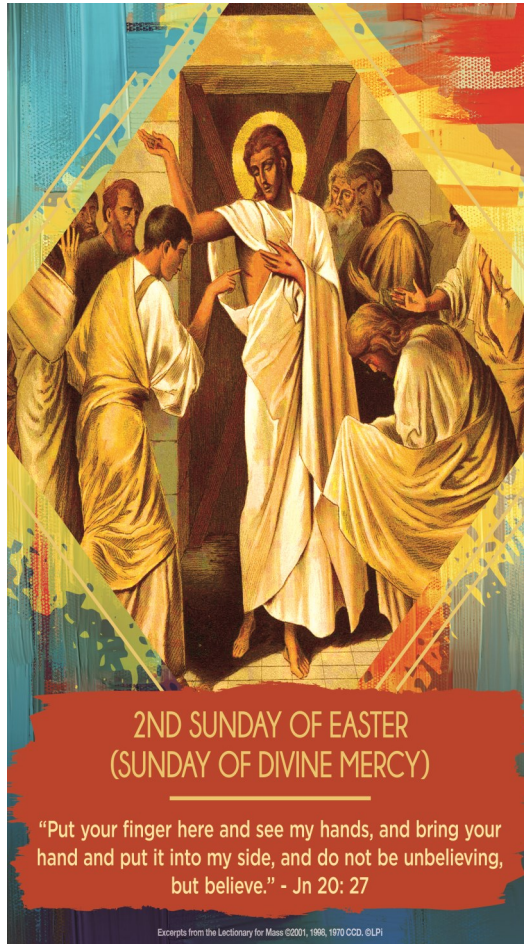

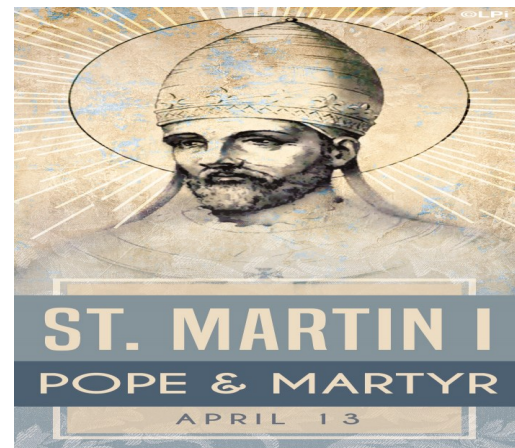

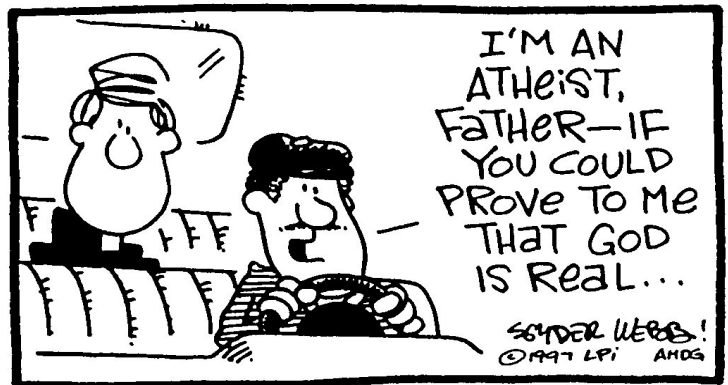

## Invite One Back Initiative

It's a familiar story: the family you used to see at Mass every week slowly stopped showing up when "life got busy." Or maybe there's an elderly parishioner you haven't seen since the COVID-19 pandemic a few years ago. Noticeable or not, we all have holes in our pews. A 2014 PEW study found that 13% of all U.S. adults are former Catholics—and that was ten years ago! That means for every convert to the faith, there are at least 6.5 fallen-away Catholics. COVID-19 amplified this problem. A 2022 CARA study showed a 7% decline in Sunday Mass attendance compared with pre-COVID data. This significant portion of Catholics lost connection with their local parish during the shut-downs, and just never came back.

IT'S TIME TO BRING THEM HOME! In this Year of Parish Revival, the USCCB National Eucharistic Revival recently launched a initiative called Invite One Back." It is a renewed effort to personally reach out to parishioners that we haven't seen in a while for whatever reason and to invite them back to Sunday Mass. The goal of this initiative is to fill the pews again. To do that, we all need to invite back everyone who has left in a way that makes sure they feel seen and desired as an individual member of our parish family. Whom are you called to invite home? Over the next few weeks, we will be exploring different options to further this initiative within the Cathedral parish. We need your help! As the beautiful events of Holy Week and Easter approach, we are asking you to reach out to someone you know and invite them back to Mass this Easter! How wonderful would it be during the Easter Season to witness people renewing their

**Why do Catholics go to Confessions?** Disobeying God damages our friendship with him, so we need his forgiveness to heal it. That is why Jesus initiated the Sacrament of Reconciliation (also called "Confession"). *"Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven"* (Matthew 16:19). This brings us back to God. In Confessions, we admit what we did, say that we are sorry, and resolve never to do it again. Penance helps us make up for it. When the priest conveys Christ's forgiveness to us, our friendship is restored.

### Why is Mass Offered for Specific People?

The greatest prayer that we have as Christians is the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. At each Mass, Christ's Sacrifice on Calvary is re-presented and renewed. In the Mass, the graces achieved on the Cross are applied to souls for their salvation. This is why we have Masses offered for particular intentions. To have a Mass offered for a loved one, living or deceased, please contact Steph. Having intentions for a Mass is a sacrifice of \$10.00 during the week and \$20.00 on the weekend. Call the church office during regular hours if you have any questions.

### Sanctuary Candle Intentions

The red Sanctuary Lamp by the Tabernacle burns to remind us of the Eucharistic presence of Jesus Christ. It is a mark of honor to remind the faithful of the Real Presence of Christ, and is a profession of their love and affection for our Lord. If you wish to have the Sanctuary Lamp burning in memory of a loved one, to honor a special occasion, or a special intention make arrangements with Steph. The cost of the candle is \$20.00. It will burn for (2) weeks. The memorial will also be published in the Bulletin.

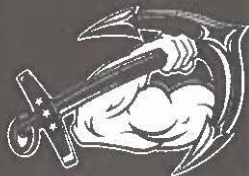

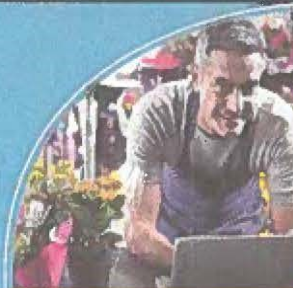
