## Pastor's Perusings - Trinity Sunday

With the end of the Easter Season, we have returned to the that most common time of the liturgical year known as Ordinary Time. These first few Sundays in Ordinary Time following the Easter Season, however, are not Ordinary Sundays but are great Solemnities which mark some aspect of the mystery of our Faith. This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, a feast which can be traced back to 1334 when Pope John XXII declared it a feast on the universal calendar of the Church.

The Blessed Trinity is the central doctrine of Christianity: the truth that in the unity of the Godhead there are Three Persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, these Three Persons being truly distinct one from another. We read in the Athanasian Creed, one of the ancient Symbols of Faith, that "the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God, and yet there are not three Gods but one God".

The mystery of the Blessed Trinity is something that we will never fully understand, not even during the eternity we hope to spend with God in the everlasting life to come. But this same mystery of the Blessed Trinity reveals to us the deepest reasons for why we were made: to love and be loved. In the Trinity, there exists a communion of Divine Persons who are in a constant exchange of love. The love that God offers is radically different than what the world understands as love. Whereas the world would offers us a concept of "love" that is self-indulgent and seeks only to satisfy the pleasures one desires; the love that exists within the Trinity, the love for which we were made, is marked by the total gift of self which fulfills us instead of leaving us empty. This love that derives from the Trinity is focused on the beloved and not on one's self. It is outward not inward focused. Pope Benedict XVI said that the strongest proof that we are made in the image of the Trinity is this: only love makes us happy because we live in relation and we live to love and be loved. The love that the Trinity offers gives us fulfillment and brings us joy and peace.

So often "mystery" is seen as a negative connotation, seen as something unsaid or undefined, or something we humans cannot know. It is true our human minds can never fully grasp the entirety of the doctrine, but the mystery is knowing just enough to want to know and seek more. A mystery of faith should be a magnet that draws us farther and inspires us to delve deeper in our quest to know, love and serve God. Trying to understand the nature of God is one thing, but entering into a real and personal relationship with each of the Persons of the Trinity is something else entirely.

The great joy of this doctrine of the Trinity is that we are no longer outsiders to God's family. In His Incarnation, our Lord united our humanity to His Divinity and elevated our human nature to something greater than what it was. In His Passion, Death, and Resurrection, he conquered sin and death so we might have eternal life. In His Ascension, our Lord, in His Resurrected body, places our human nature at the right hand of the Father. The sending of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost to dwell in the hearts and souls of the faithful shows us that God continues to be present and active in our lives. All this is possible because we became beloved sons and daughters of God at our baptism. We were welcomed into this communion of love where we find the fulfillment, peace, and joy that can only be found in God. We were made in the image and likeness of God and it is only God who can satisfy the deepest longings of our hearts.

I leave the final word on the Trinity to Pope Saint John Paul II who described the Trinity as: "A great mystery, a mystery of love, an ineffable mystery, before which words must give way to the silence of wonder and worship. A divine mystery that challenges and involves us, because a share in the Trinitarian life was given to us through grace, through the redemptive Incarnation of the Word and the gift of the Holy Spirit."

We are looking forward to May 31st when Deacon John will be ordained to the priesthood and become Father Soplinski. Let us aid him in his final week of preparations with our own prayers and penances that we offer up for Deacon John that he may become a good, faithful, and holy priest. Father Soplinski's Mass of Thanksgiving will be at our parish on Saturday, June 1st, at 9 a.m. I hope many of us will be there to witness a great event in the life of our parish and to join in celebrating with Father Soplinski at the light reception to follow his Mass of Thanksgiving in our parish hall.

We will be welcoming our seminarian for the summer, Dominic Re, who will begin his assignment on Monday, June 3rd. Please pray for all the seminarians who will be starting their summer assignments and keep Dominic in your prayers that he arrives safely here in Paradise! - Fr. Golna

Final destination is Bellaire Marina in Bellaire, Ohio. Arrival of National Eucharistic Pilgrimage in Wheeling—7:30-8:30 p.m. Cathedral of St. Joseph. Bishop Brennan and the faithful of Wheeling will welcome the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage at the cathedral.

**Invite One Back Initiative**

It's a familiar story: the family you used to see at Mass every week slowly stopped showing up when “life got busy.” Or maybe there's an elderly parishioner you haven't seen since the COVID-19 pandemic a few years ago. Noticeable or not, we all have holes in our pews. A 2014 PEW study found that 13% of all U.S. adults are former Catholics—and that was ten years ago! That means for every convert to the faith, there are at least 6.5 fallen-away Catholics. COVID-19 amplified this problem. A 2022 CARA study showed a 7% decline in Sunday Mass attendance compared with pre-COVID data. This significant portion of Catholics lost connection with their local parish during the shut-downs, and just never came back.

IT'S TIME TO BRING THEM HOME! In this Year of Parish Revival, the USCCB National Eucharistic Revival recently launched a initiative called Invite One Back." It is a renewed effort to personally reach out to parishioners that we haven't seen in a while for whatever reason and to invite them back to Sunday Mass. The goal of this initiative is to fill the pews again. To do that, we all need to invite back everyone who has left in a way that makes sure they feel seen and desired as an individual

**Why do Catholics go to Confessions?** Disobeying God damages our friendship with him, so we need his forgiveness to heal it. That is why Jesus initiated the Sacrament of Reconciliation (also called “Confession”). *“Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven”* (Matthew 16:19). This brings us back to God. In Confessions, we admit what we did, say that we are sorry, and resolve never to do it again. Penance helps us make up for it. When the priest conveys Christ's forgiveness to us, our friendship is restored.

**Why is Mass Offered for Specific People?**

The greatest prayer that we have as Christians is the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. At each Mass, Christ's Sacrifice on Calvary is re-presented and renewed. In the Mass, the graces achieved on the Cross are applied to souls for their salvation. This is why we have Masses offered for particular intentions. To have a Mass offered for a loved one, living or deceased, please contact Steph. Having intentions for a Mass is a sacrifice of \$10.00 during the week and \$20.00 on the weekend. Call the church office during regular hours if you have any questions.

**Sanctuary Candle Intentions**

The red Sanctuary Lamp by the Tabernacle burns to remind us of the Eucharistic presence of Jesus Christ. It is a mark of honor to remind the faithful of the Real Presence of Christ, and is a profession of their love and affection for our Lord. If you wish to have the Sanctuary Lamp burning in memory of a loved one, to honor a special occasion, or a special intention make arrangements with Steph. The cost of the candle is \$20.00. It will burn for (2) weeks. The memorial will also be published in the Bulletin.

Remember to silence, turn off, and put away your cell phones, tablets, and gaming devices prior to the start of Mass.

**Communion Fast**

Keep in mind the Communion fast—we are to fast from food and drink (water and medicine excluded) one hour before receiving Holy Communion. **This includes chewing gum.** Let us prepare our body and soul to worthily receive our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.
